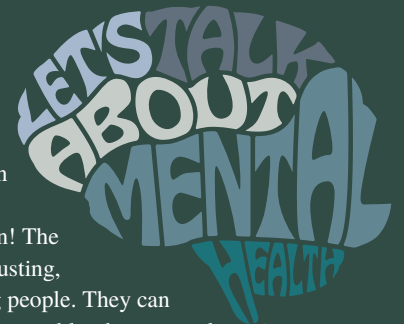


WHAT LEADERSHIP MEANS TO ME

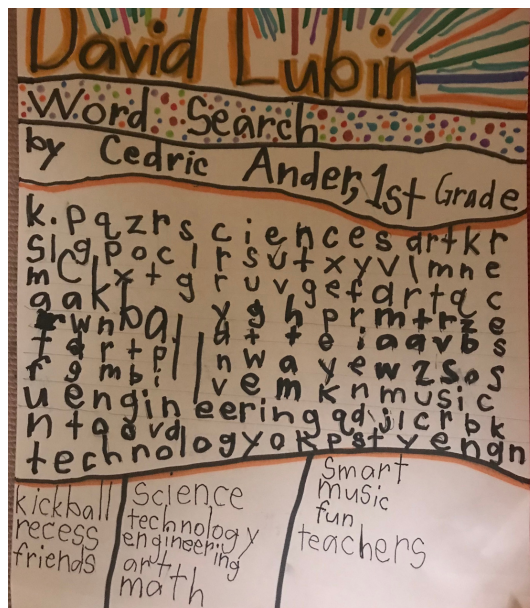
David Lubin Celebrates Ruby Bridges

On November 14, students celebrated Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day. Students learned about 6-year-old Ruby Bridges, the first African American student to attend an all-white school on November 14, 1960. To honor Ruby, David Lubin's Diversity Equity and Inclusion officers Amar Cid and Joe Porras organized two groups of students to walk to school, one from Oak Park and the other from East Portal Park. The first-grade students then led an on-campus assembly, sharing the history of Ruby Bridges Day and how it began at Martin Elementary School in South San Francisco. David Lubin first grade teacher Mrs. Hashimoto said, "I am super excited we are able to celebrate a living legend," and reports that our school is working with Martin Elementary to make Ruby Bridges Day a national holiday.

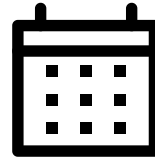
