Project	Description
Art	Funding provides all David Lubin students with art instruction, including campus-wide art projects like the Chalk Walk and annual art show, led by the one and only, Ms. Jane
School Gardens	Funding provides the school community with the tools and materials to maintain David Lubin's many gardens, including the alphabet garden in the Kindergarten playground
STEAM Night	STEAM Night is a free family event hosted each spring. Hands-on booths related to science, technology, engineering, art, and math are hosted by parents, local businesses and the PTG. This year, we are hoping to have an "anchor" event to open the event before the parent/PTG booths open.
STEAM Labs	STEAM Labs are monthly lessons that will take place in our new STEAM room. Led by classroom teachers, labs will focus on a wide range of science standards and be differentiated for all grade levels.

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Maker Mondays	During Maker Mondays, Fifth grade math and science students assume the role of engineers following a “shark tank” like process to create inventions that solve every-day problems in our world.
Sutter's Fort	Fourth grade students participate in the Sutter’s Fort Environmental Living Program (ELP), a 24 hours experience at Sutter’s Fort that engages students in hands-on activities that were typical at the fort between 1839-1850.
Sensory Paths	A sensory path is a series of guided movements for kids to follow, shown by markings on the ground or walls. As students follow the path and complete the movements, they regulate their sensory systems, improve their motor skills, and prepare their minds and bodies for learning.
SIPPS Training	SIPPS is a research-based foundational skills program proven to help both new and struggling readers, including English learners and students identified with dyslexia. The program’s systematic scope and sequence provides a structured-literacy approach to instruction through explicit routines focused on phonological awareness, spelling-sounds, and sight words.
Instructional Aides	The need for reading intervention at David Lubin is high. Having additional staff on hand will support our teachers' ability to reach every student through the use of small group instruction. These groups will be led by classroom teachers or aides to address students' specific reading needs using their SIPPS training as a foundational resource
